


Every hour, at least one person dies of asthma in Western Europe.

Outdoor air pollution costs us our children's future

- 350,000 people die each year in the EU from air pollution.
- The financial burden of asthma in the EU amounts to nearly €17.7bn
- We now know children living close to busy roads have an approximate 50% increased risk of experiencing respiratory illness, including asthma and reduced lung function over their lifetime.

Government Action Needed

- Urgent measures have to be taken by Governments to switch clean energy sources
- Provide access to these for the most vulnerable
 - Social support for families with children
- Appropriate legislation on indoor air quality norms and enforcement in schools
