HEAL's Action on Pesticides

Week Without Pesticides

The 20th-30th March was International Week Without Pesticides. The campaign, which started in France four years ago, aims to raise awareness of the risks to health and the environment poised by pesticides and to highlight alternative solutions.

With the continuing success of the French campaign, this year the movement expanded across Europe and parts of Africa, highlighting the numerous alternatives to pesticide use.

French campaign - Coordinated by Action Citizen for Alternatives to Pesticides (ACAP), a network of 170 organisations coordinated by MDRGF, a HEAL member. Over 600 events took place over the ten days. This year, for the first time, all regions of France took part. The French campaign focused on pesticide use in gardens. Read more [here](#)

The EU campaign - HEAL member, Pesticide Action Network Europe organised a week-long exhibition in the European Economic and Social Committee showcasing alternatives to pesticide use and good practice examples. Policy and science news

On 23rd February The European Parliament's Committee on Environment, Public Health and Food Safety (ENVI) discussed the draft report on the EU Biocides law by rapporteur Christa Klass (PPE, Germany). In the debate, Members of the ENVI Committee stressed the need to improve the Commission proposal and the rapporteur's draft report to better protect health and the environment.

Prior to this discussion, HEAL together with the Pesticide Action Network and other partners, sent a letter to MEPs urging them to introduce changes to ensure the comprehensive phasing-out of hazardous substances, a low-risk approach without loopholes, the better protection of vulnerable groups, and other crucial issues. The ENVI Committee is scheduled to vote on the draft report at the end of April. Read the joint NGO letter [here](#).

UN experts call for two pesticides to join international trade watch list.

United Nations experts have recommended that two pesticides be added to a trade "watch list" under a UN-backed treaty aimed at helping poorer countries more effectively manage potentially harmful imported substances. Endosulfan and azinphos-methyl, each pose an unacceptably high risk to human health and the environment, according to the Chemical Review Committee (CRC) of the Rotterdam Convention on the Prior Informed Consent (PIC) Procedure for Certain Hazardous Chemicals and Pesticides in International Trade. Pesticide chlorpyrifos is linked to childhood developmental delays.

Exposure to the pesticide chlorpyrifos—which is banned for use in households in the US (but not in the EU) but is still widely used throughout the agricultural industry - is associated with early childhood developmental delays, according to a new study. Read more [here](#).

Neurobehavioral Deficits and Increased Blood Pressure in School-Age Children Prenatally Exposed to Pesticides.
